The Private George Phillips Detachment #1214, Ballwin, Missouri was chartered in 2005 and is proud to honor a local Marine who, at age 18, gave his life so that his fellow Marines may live. For sacrificing his life on 14 March 1945, Pvt. George Phillips was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor, and is buried at Bethel Cemetery in Labadie, Missouri. Since the Detachment received its charter, we have provided and continue to provide volunteer support and financial assistance to area Marines and their families as well as many veteran and Marine Corps related charitable organizations such as: Toys for Tots Campaign, FOCUS Marines Foundation, St. Louis and Franklin County Honor Flight, Missouri USO, Jefferson Barracks, Missouri State Veterans Home, Marine Corps Foundation, Fisher House, Heroes Care, St. Louis Warrior Support Foundation, and many others. In Fiscal Year 2016, our Detachment contributed over \$7,800.00 to these and other worthwhile causes. Our Detachment currently has 103 members, drawing from St. Louis City, St. Louis County, and Franklin County. Chaplain's Message

In the Christian life, sometimes things happen which scare the daylights out of you. You may have been in the wrong place at the wrong time and had bad luck, or you have done something contrary to God's will. In either case the result may be designated what 1 Peter 4:12 calls *a fiery trial*. "Beloved, think it not strange concerning the fiery trial which is to try you as though some strange thing happened to you."

So, what do you do? When I had fiery trials in my early Christian life some well-meaning people said, "There are other people in the same boat." Well, I didn't care who and how many were in the same boat, I wanted to know how to get out of it. Yet, sometimes one can't get out of that boat, but must learn how to operate it. In the movie and book, *The African* Queen, the missionary lady asked her companion, the practical man, how does one steer a boat in a fast-moving river. He said you make the boat go faster than the current. To apply that analogy to a person's Christian life, how does one make his personal boat go faster than the current of events in a fiery trial? He uses prayer and the reading of the Word to ask God for guidance and the power to move the boat faster than the situation. The Bible in Romans 10:17 says, "Faith cometh by hearing and hearing by the Word of God." Faith is trusting in what God tells you *specifically to do* as written in the Word, or trusting God as he takes you by the hand, and guides through the situation via promptings from your conscience (which will not violate the written Word).

Getting through the circumstances may still be scary, but the final results will be the peace of God which passes all understanding.

Elected Positions

Commandant

Leadership of the Detachment. Chief Executive Officer of the Detachment. responsible for the activities, financial standings, and the image portrayed in the community and the League. Presides over meetings, formulates and develops programs, appoints committees, and represents the Detachment.

Senior Vice-Commandant

Marine Corps Humor

As we think of the snows of far-off northern lands where detachment members like **Harry Hope** marched to victory with the frozen Chosin, Saint Louis weather sometimes seems in line with the following story submitted in the February 2012 newsletter by **Lyle Mcfarlin:**

I just got an email from a friend in northern North Dakota near the Canadian border. He said that since early this morning the snow has nearly reached waist high and is still falling. The temperature is dropping way below zero and the north wind is increasing to near gale force. His wife has done nothing all day but look through the kitchen window and just stare.

He says that if it gets much worse, he may have to let her in.

Iwo Jima Remembered: Missouri Marines With updates from March 2012 newsletter.

The land battle of Iwo Jima took place on February 19 through March 26, 1945. That was seventy-nine years ago, consisting of thirty-five of the bloodiest, yet most heroic days in United States Marine Corps history.

However, before joining our detachment, I had never heard of its namesake, Private George Phillips and his Medal of Honor sacrifice at Iwo Jima. Also, as a Viet Nam era veteran who did well in Marine Corps History in boot camp, I just knew slightly more about the battle of Iwo Jima than the average person. (That included knowing who was there other than John Basilone). On the other hand, I could mention by name most of the famous Americans present at the siege of the Alamo which took place on some of the same days, one hundred-nine years earlier (February 23 through March 6, 1836). I decided to correct that under-sight by writing a special article for this edition of the newsletter; especially after I learned our detachment contains four Iwo Jima veterans. This includes **Bill Bragg**, who was awarded the Bronze Star for his action at Iwo. The other three are **Del Hoffarth**, who celebrated his 19th birthday, Monday, March, 8, during the battle; Elmer Dapron, who has been back to Iwo on two occasions; during one he returned to Saint Louis with several pounds of the sands of Iwo Jima (that he then had to fight to protect from confiscation at the airport; he ceremonially sprinkles some on Pvt Phillips' grave each year); finally, Walter Zmaila, who I have not been able to reach.

(Note: from the editor. I later met and visited Walter Zmaila, who presented me with some sands of Iwo Jima. I also was contacted by Phil Muzik, a Navy Corpsman, who had the distinction of being blown up on the first day of Iwo Jima. After he woke up four days later on a

hospital ship, he was rushed back into the fight. Then in 2015 I met a sixth Iwo Jima veteran at a church concert in Saint Charles named **Deward Terry**), who became a remote member of our detachment until he passed away in 2021. Actually, all six have reported to their next duty station.)

In dedication to these six and as well to the rest of us let me mention some of the Medal of Honor and Navy Cross Missouri Heroes of Iwo Jima.

The first Navy Cross was awarded months before the main battle to Lt William Morton Miller USNR of Cape Girardeau, Missouri, October, 12, 1944. He was commander of a Navy Patrol plane in VPB-117 in action against the Japanese in the vicinity of Iwo Jima. He and another plane, whose commander also received the Navy Cross, searched for survivors of a downed plane while aiding in the destruction of six out of eight opposing aircraft.

The Medal of Honor was awarded for actions on February 19, 1945, the first day of the land battle, to **Sergeant Darrel S. of Cole** of Park Hills, Missouri. As a leader of a machinegun section of Company B, First Battalion, Twenty-Third Marines, Fourth Marine Division, Sergeant Cole single-handedly destroyed five enemy positions with hand grenades before being killed with a hand grenade. He is buried in Parkview Cemetery, Farmington, Missouri and is the namesake of the destroyer USS Cole which was attacked by Osama bin Laden's followers in Yemen.

A Navy Cross was awarded for actions on February 19, 1945, to **Captain Dwayne E. Mears**, USMCR, born in Ava, Missouri. Commanding Officer of the Assault Company, First Battalion, Twenty-Eighth Marines, Fifth Marine Division, Captain Mears, armed with a pistol, rallied his two assault platoons, destroyed four stubborn installations, and within ninety minutes of landing cut seven hundred yards through resistance, cutting the narrow neck of the island in half, and isolated Mt Suribachi. He succumbed the next day.

A Navy Cross was awarded for actions on February 19 through March 17, 1945, to Pvt Charles M. Sheehan USMCR of Belleville, Illinois. Serving as a flame thrower operator in Company K, Third Battalion, Twenty-Fifth Marines, Fourth Marine Division, he silenced three enemy guns on February 22. On another occasion when his flame thrower was hit, he grabbed an automatic rifle from a wounded comrade and finished destroying a bunker.

A Navy Cross was awarded for actions on February 19, 1945, to Pvt Delbert B. Maupin USMCR of Hannibal, Missouri. A rifleman serving in Company I, Third Battalion, Twenty-Fifth Marines, Fourth Marine Division, in close combat he saw a grenade fall near his squad leader. He jumped in-between and received the full blast. Although seriously wounded, he then annihilated the attacking enemy with rifle fire.

A Navy Cross was awarded for actions on February 23, 1945, to **First Lieutenant Harold George Schrier** USMCR, of Corder, Missouri. Executive Officer of Company E, Second Battalion, Twenty-Eighth Marines, Fifth Marine Division, Captain Schrier led a fortyman patrol up Mt Suribachi AND RAISED THE FIRST AMERICAN FLAG.

The Medal of Honor was awarded to **Pharmacist's Mate Third Class Jack Williams** for action on March 3, 1945.
Attached to Third Battalion, Twenty-Eighth Marines, Fifth Marine Division, Williams went to the aid of a wounded Marine during a grenade battle. He administered first aid while being hit three times. He remained in the area to tend to another Marine; when he went to get aid for himself, he was killed by a sniper. Born In Harrison, Arkansas, he's buried in Springfield National Cemetery, Springfield, Missouri.

A Navy Cross was awarded for actions on March 13, 1945, to **PFC Donald E. Schmille** USMCR, of Kansas City, Kansas. Serving in Company C, First Battalion, Twenty-Seventh Marines, Fifth Marine Division, Schmille took out an eight-inch gun that was blasting his company's night position; he walked twenty yards ahead of his lines during a grenade barrage and scored a direct hit on the gun with his rocket launcher.

The Medal of Honor was awarded to **Pvt George Phillips** for his action on March 14, 1945. Serving in Second Battalion, Twenty-Eighth Marines, Fifth Marine Division, Phillips stood guard alone while his squad rested after a night of bitter hand grenade fighting. He was the only person alerted when a grenade was tossed into their midst. He shouted a warning, and then fell on the grenade, absorbing the full force of the blast. Born in Bates County, Missouri, he's buried in Bethel Cemetery, Labadie, Missouri. He is the namesake of the Pvt George Phillips Detachment of the Marine Corps League, for who I have the honor of writing this article for this newsletter.

A Navy Cross was awarded for actions on March 15, 1945, to **Pvt Frank L. Palmer** USMCR, born in Aurora, Missouri. Serving as a radio operator in Company D, Second Battalion, Twenty-Sixth Marines, Fifth Marine Division, Palmer used grenades in more than one assault to annihilate or route enemy concealed in spider traps and pillboxes.

In conclusion, this is not all of the Missouri related Marines and is certainly not all of the stories of Iwo Jima. But it is the best I could learn about the Medal of Honor and Navy Cross stories and it does fill in some necessary spaces to me of who was at Iwo Jima.


